Calvary Cemetery Regulations and required Monument Approval Permit. Also, please remove old artificial flowers after two (2) months, as the petals begin to fall off and ants and stinging insects set up in them.

Elite Medical Imaging

October 27 - 28 St. Joseph Catholic Church hosts Elite Medical Imaging, a Preventive Ultrasound Health Screening in the Parish Activity Center. Ultrasound screenings are painless, non-invasive and contain no radiation. Eight preventive screenings will be offered: **carotid artery, abdominal aorta, thyroid, liver, spleen, gallbladder and both kidneys**. These screenings are not typically done at physician visits or at annual exams. Insurance Companies will not pay for them, unless you are symptomatic. Screenings will be offered for \$49 each or the full preventive package (all 8 areas) for \$150. Flex spending accounts may be used and all other forms of payment are accepted the day of the screening. Our radiologist recommends these screenings be considered on an annual basis as a preventive measure. Results can change from one year to the next based on age, stress factors and lifestyle. A representative will visit the church October 21-22 and offer pre-registration. You may call in ahead of time if you wish and secure your preferred appointment time. **Please call 713-568-8331 TODAY!**
