Hundreds of our neighbors in the Brazos Valley find it hard to get by and struggle to have enough food for their families. Lack of enough affordable housing, good paying jobs and uncertain health care is a daily disaster situation for them. Once again this November, Catholic parishioners have an opportunity to reach out to our community in a simple, meaningful way. A yearly effort of the St. Vincent de Paul Society provides 200 low or no-income families with bags of groceries to help them during this holiday. How can you help?

• **Bring non-perishable food items** to the SVdP food drive at church from **October 30 - November 13**. Here are the needs:

- **2 cans of any other vegetables, 2 cans of fruit;**

Construction Projects Completed

Construction on the Church Roof Replacement began in April. Soon after roof construction began, the A/C system for the Church and Rectory stopped functioning after 60 years and replacement parts were no longer available. Most of the \$1.2 million price tag for the new roof was covered by our property insurance with the Diocese of Austin. The Church is responsible to pay the \$5,000. deductible and some miscellaneous improvements. The HVAC system is NOT covered by our insurance and its price tag was \$600,000. If you wish to participate in underwriting some of the cost of these two projects, envelopes are available at the main entrance of the church.

At time of publication, the total is: \$ 176,133.00
